Mission Statement

We want all adults and children to: **Be the best they can** in order to have best possible start in life and to make the most of the gifts God has given. To achieve this, we teach everyone "Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart" (Colossians 3:23) by;

- Set ambitious targets for all pupils and staff
- Continually look for ways to improve
- Have high expectations of behaviour for all

We encourage children to: **Join in Learning,** to promote academic excellence and to inspire everyone to value the importance of education in wider society. The bible teaches us God will "Instruct us in the way of knowledge and wisdom and lead us along straight paths" (Proverbs 4:11). To achieve this we;

- Provide an engaging curriculum with opportunities for learning in a variety of contexts
- Strive for all lessons to be focussed and engaging to allow all children to achieve
- Support deeper levels of understanding so that children can apply learning to different settings

For children to: **Join in Play** is important at BJR because Play is essential for everyone's social and emotional development. It is a vital life skill which helps children to form the adult they will become building trust, forgiveness and resilience. Play is the foundation for learning compassion and the Golden Rule "Do to others as you would have them do to you" (Luke 6:31). To promote positive play we;

- Have dedicated staff who promote play EVERY PLAYTIME
- Promote the importance of play through PLAY DAYs
- Invest in the playground as a learning resource

We want the school community to: **Join in Prayer** as Christians believe that this is fundamental to developing a relationship with God as well as giving thanks and praise. We should "Always be joyful. Never stop praying. Whatever happens, give thanks, because it is God's will." (Thessalonians 5:16-18). We encourage this though;

- High quality collective worship for all children
- Daily acts of prayer
- Valuing the essential role of our School Chaplain

We believe that we should: **Remember God's Word,** as this is at the very Foundation of being a Christian school. In promoting a practical understanding and application of Christian Values we strive to; "Train up a child in the way they should go, And when they are old they will not depart from it" (Proverbs 22:6) through;

- Providing High quality RE teaching and daily collective worship for all children
- Regular visits to church and other places of worship

In all aspects of school life, our school vision is key to ensuring that Bishop John Robinson CofE Primary School offers the best education money can't buy. Our history and naval links, our entire spiritual and ethical ethos, and our approach to the school's curriculum is rooted in our individual and corporate identity: "Jesus is the anchor of my soul." (Hebrews 9:16).



Aims

- To help learners to develop a knowledge and understanding of the Christian faith.
- To further learners' growth and development through the study of Christian ethics, morals and values.
- To provide opportunities for learners to study the practices, beliefs and values of other faiths.
- To foster sensitivity and respect for the beliefs of others.
- To contribute to learners' experience of Christianity as a living faith.
- To establish a structured framework for the teaching of Religious Education using the Schemes of Work adopted by our school.
- To provide opportunities for assessment and continuity of progress in the teaching of Religious Education from Foundation Stage to Year 6.
- To foster a sense of awe and wonder of the world and creation.
- To provide opportunities to reflect on feelings and beliefs.
- To provide opportunities to explore a sense of commitment.
- To explore the various emotions experienced in life.

Time and Place

All classes experience a Religious Education Learning Session once a week. In Foundation Stage, the learning session lasts for approximately 45 minutes and is often integrated with other areas of learning, as suggested in the Early Years Guidelines. In Key Stages 1 and 2 the learning sessions are between 90 minutes and 120 minutes. The class teacher is responsible for the planning and delivery of the learning session.

The RE Syllabus

At Bishop John Robinson CofE Primary we have developed a Curriculum using Schemes of Work from the Southwark Diocese.

Assessment

The two Attainment Targets (AT1: Learning about religion and AT2: Learning from religion) are covered in the RE Scheme of Work.

- Staff are expected to level pupils in both Attainment Targets at the end of each unit.
- Data drops are collated by the Deputy Head teacher and pupils progress and attainment is monitored in line with other core subjects.

Environment for Learning

- Every class within school is expected to have an RE display focusing on their current topic from the Scheme of Work.
- Working Walls will include vocabulary, questions, prompts, texts and quotes, as appropriate.

Monitoring

RE within school is monitored through:

- Book looks
- Data drops
- Learning walks
- Lesson observations



- CPD
- In school INSET takes place 3 times per year as part of our staff meeting programme.
- Staff are encouraged to attend training provided by the SDBE.
- NQTs will be expected to attend the SDBE training course as part of their NQT year induction programme.
- Staff new to church schools are expected to attend training through the SDBE

Inclusion

The parent's right of withdrawal, as expressed in the 1988 Education Reform Act is respected. A parent must express in writing their wish to withdraw their child from the Religious Education Curriculum, this would be followed up with a discussion with the Head teacher. Such pupils will be asked to sit in another classroom during the RE learning sessions and complete additional work on morals / values. Pupils withdrawn from RE will not accompany their class on educational visits to places of worship.

Religious Literacy

We encourage our pupils to make informed decisions about the world around them. To support pupils' understanding of religion, philosophy, ethics and morals, we promote the fundamental aspects of Religious Literacy through our RE lessons and PSHE discussions.
