

Pupils Walking Home

Parents and carers of pupils in Key Stage 2 (Years 3-6) are able to request permission for their child to be dismissed directly from school at 3:15pm. They will be expected to leave the school site and either meet you or an arranged appropriate adult in a designated spot or to walk home unaccompanied. If you would like to request permission for this, please contact the school office for a permission form. Please note, as children are in their uniform, they are representing our school to the local community. If children do not behave appropriately on their way out of school, the permission will be withdrawn. Please also ensure that if your child walks to school unaccompanied in the morning that they behave safely and appropriately.



Polite Reminders
