#### **English** Maths In English, we will be reading a new class text titled In Maths, we will solve problems including missing 'Leon and the Place Between'. - In coding, we will compare Scratch to other programming environments they may have experienced, before familiarising themselves with the basic layout of the screen.

- In History we will explore the causes of the First World War and the different sources that inform us about what life was like at the Western Front.
- In addition, we will write a diary about life in the trenches while looking at the different sources
