



<b>English</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>In English, we will be reading a new class text, <i>Rooftoppers</i> by Katherine Rundell. <i>Rooftoppers</i> is about a girl called Sophie, who is discovered floating at sea. The story takes Sophie to a world up on the rooftops of Paris, where she searches for her mother.</li><li>Peace Class will be continuing to practise writing narratives. We will focus on writing descriptive settings and using dialogue to convey character and further the action.</li><li>We will be writing short setting descriptions, diary entries and letters, using the story as a stimulus.</li></ul>	<b>Maths</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>In Maths we will be continuing to learn about shape.</li><li>We will be focusing on angles, classifying angles and using a protractor to measure angles correctly and accurately.</li><li>We will also revise our knowledge on regular and irregular polygons, and link our new knowledge on angles to apply to this.</li><li>Peace Class will also look at statistics and data analysis this term.</li><li>The class will continue to develop skills in Maths fluency and continue to practise their reasoning skills.</li></ul>
<b>Religious Education</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>In RE this term, Peace Class will continue to study Islam. We will focus on how Muslims show commitment through faith, and compare this to other religious practices.</li><li>We will focus on the Five Pillars of Islam, and acknowledge how Muslims use the Five Pillars of Islam to lead a good, holy life.</li><li>We will also look at pilgrimages within the Islamic faith, and compare these to the pilgrimages we looked at earlier in the year.</li></ul>	<b>Science</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Miss Parr will continue teaching Science in fortnightly blocks. Initially we will complete, review and assess our last topic before moving on to our new topic, which will be Earth and Space. We will explore the solar system and its planets. We will explore the Earth's movement in relation to day and night. We will also look at the movement of the moon.</li></ul>
<b>Art, Design Technology &amp; Music</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>In Music, we will analyse a new song, <i>Dancing in The Street</i> by Martha and The Vandellas.</li><li>We will look at how music has changed throughout time, and how music can influence the world. We will look at all of the songs we have listened to so far and think about how they reflect changes in society.</li><li>In DT, Peace Class will design a mountain range using papier mache.</li><li>In Art, the class will create a solar system model using paints. We will also look at landscapes in relation to our class text, <i>Rooftoppers</i>. We will compare the London skyline with the skyline of Paris, and create silhouette artworks which reflect this.</li></ul>	<b>Computing, Geography &amp; History</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>In Geography, we will be learning about the continent of Africa.</li><li>The overarching question for this unit are: What are the physical and human features of Nigeria? What are the physical and human features of Morocco? How has political unrest affected the economy and development in Africa? What are the different biomes within South Africa? What are similarities and differences of the human and physical features of Africa and the United Kingdom?</li><li>In Computing, the class will continue to learn about the importance of E-Safety. They will then begin a new unit on coding.</li></ul>
<b>Citizenship &amp; My Happy Mind</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>This half term, we will be completing the unit <i>Relate</i> in <i>My Happy Mind</i>. We will then begin the final <i>My Happy Mind</i> unit, <i>Engage</i>.</li><li>The <i>Engage</i> unit focuses on how the pupils can use everything they have learned over the year. This</li></ul>	<b>PE</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>In PE, the class will look at a range of sports and develop a multitude of methods to develop our skills in throwing, catching and moving.</li><li>We will be practising events on the lead up to Sports Day.</li></ul>
